# Camporee Introduction

In February 2010 BSA began its celebration of the 100<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of Scouting. This year our Camporee is centered on the basic themes of scouting that have flourished over the past 100 years. In addition, we have brought back some of the traditional scout skills of the past to honor our heritage.

This years Camporee will feature patrol and troop events and activities which will take us back to the basics of Scouting. Patrols will have the opportunity to compete in events which will test there scout knowledge, outdoor skills and teamwork. Troops will also participate in Troop activities which will be both challenging and fun.

We are making an effort to have the Scouts participate in Camporee management, leadership and staff. The committee is still in need of additional Life and Eagle Scouts to work on Camporee staff. Scoutmasters should contact Marcus Sneed or Kirk Wille with staff nominations. Contact info is located on the last page of this Leaders Guide.

Our Camporee activities will begin with an opening flag ceremony followed by a Troop Uniform Inspection on Saturday morning. Patrol Events will follow for the remainder of the morning. After the patrol events conclude at noon, we will all break for lunch. The Troop Games and other activities will begin after lunch. After the Troop activities conclude in the afternoon, the troops will return to their campsites for dinner. The Campfire and OA Call Out will follow dinner.

## Check-In Procedure

1. As you enter camp identify what unit you are with to check in with the Camporee staff and they will direct you to your campsite location.
2. After the campsite is located, Troops may unload quickly and remove vehicles to the parking lot. **NO VEHICLE MAY BE LEFT IN THE CAMPSITE!**
3. Have ONE ADULT come to registration with:
  - Money (or receipt for registration fees) 5 points
  - Copy of the Guide to Safe Scouting 5 points
  - Completed tour permit 10 points
  - Unit roster, listing all adults and scouts in their patrols 10 points
  - Permission Slips with Medical Info for all scouts 10 points
  - Hold Harmless for all participant 10 points

# General Information

- Dates: April 30 - May 2, 2010
- Check-in: No earlier than 4:00 PM on Friday, May 1<sup>st</sup>, 2009
- Campsites: Campsites will be assigned by the number of campers pre-registered.
- Tour Permit: Required for each unit
- Parking: Parking in designated areas only. No vehicles in campsites!
- SPL/Leader Meeting:** **There will be a mandatory leader meeting Friday night at 9:00P.M for the SPL and SM/ASM. Units will receive patrol and troop activity schedule, coordinating instructions and safety brief reminders. Units in attendance will receive 25 bonus points toward overall troop score if SPL and SM attend.**
- Scout Uniform: Class A uniform for morning colors and inspection.
- Rules: All Scouting regulations will prevail
- Fires: **NO CAMP FIRES!**
- Water: Available at water spigots throughout camp.  
Washing dishes at spigots is prohibited.
- Equipment: Bring necessary equipment for camping and events.  
(Check the Events List section).
- First Aid: Provided by the Camporee in the First Aid lodge (Barn)
- Trash: Dumpsters will be available
- KYBOS: Provided throughout the camp
- Visitors: Welcome. All visitors must check-in with registration.
- Training: No adult training will be available.
- Trading Post: There will be food, drinks and snacks available Saturday afternoon.
- Campfire: Saturday evening 7:30-9:00 PM Campfire will include OA callout.
- Camp Games: Patrol Activities will be held Saturday morning. Troop activities and events will be held Saturday afternoon. Detailed schedules will be provided to each SPL at the Cracker-barrel Friday night.

- Checkout:** No patches will be given out until your campsite has been inspected and a staff member checkout slip is returned. Saturday evening checkout will be from 9:00PM to 11:00PM. Sunday morning checkout will begin at 8:00AM and vehicles may not enter camp until 7:30 AM. **NO EXCEPTIONS!** If you wish to leave earlier, pack the night before.
- Early Checkout:** Units requiring early checkout may move their vehicles to their respective campsite beginning following evening colors at 6:00PM. No vehicles should be in the camp area until 6:00 PM. Vehicles will be loaded and then moved back to the parking area prior to the Campfire at 7:30. Unit should contact the Camporee staff for camp inspection NLT 7:00PM. Units will check out and depart following the campfire program.
- Webelos Scouts:** Webelos may attend Camporee on Saturday. The Webelos schedule of events is included in the leaders guide. Webelos and their parent's may attend free of charge. Webelos leaders are encouraged to coordinate meals for Saturday lunch and Saturday dinner with an attending troop.
- Recreational Vehicles:** Due to parking limitations, no RVs, camper trailers, campers, pop up trailers, toy haulers are allowed at Camporee.
- Leave No Trace:** All participants should practice principles of Leave No Trace while attending the SM District Camporee.
- Hold Harmless:** **Every Camporee participant (Scouts, Adults, Webelos, and Visitors) must complete and sign the Informed Consent and Waiver of Liability included on page 19 of this guide. Troops must have all forms in their possession upon check-in.**

# Camporee Health and Safety

**Camporee Law:** Our Camporee has three simple rules: follow the 12 points of the Scout law, The Outdoor Code and Youth Protection Guidelines. All campers and staff conduct will be measured against these three rules. At camp, we cannot tolerate and will not permit activities, which do not meet the criteria set by these guidelines.

**Alcohol and Drugs:** No alcoholic beverages or unauthorized drugs are allowed in camp.

**Dangerous Equipment:** No rifles, handguns, ammo, bows & arrows, sheath knives, nunchuckas, bullwhips or fireworks are allowed.

**Fire or other camp-wide emergency:** The signal is announced on the P.A. system. The assembly area for emergencies is the Barn. If there is an emergency, directions will be given there. Adults should carry their vehicle keys with them at all times.

**Fires:** Extreme caution must be given at all times. Gas tanks or propane may be used inside the campsite, but not inside tents. No lanterns (except battery) are allowed inside or near tents. Each Troop should have sufficient fire buckets, a shovel and a rake.

**Hazing:** Hazing is prohibited. It could cause the Troop and Scout to be removed early.

**Foot Gear:** Walking barefoot is very dangerous and not allowed at any time. **Scouts will wear closed toe shoes at all times.**

**Rock/stick throwing:** Not allowed.

**Water Conservation:** The water supply is limited. Please take all steps possible to conserve water. A Scout is THRIFTY.

**Dehydration:** Scouts and adults will be physically active during the Camporee. As the weather may be hot, do not let dehydration become a problem. Bring canteens and/or water bottles to all activities... and drink plenty of fluids.

**Cleanliness:** Keep everything in camp clean including: event areas, campsites, tents, KYBOS and you. Use trash bags.

# Camporee Health and Safety

**Rest:** Sleep can “make or break” a great camp experience. Each person needs a certain number of hours each day to rest. Scoutmasters must ensure that their units at their campsites are quiet, out of respect for those who want to sleep or rest.

**Honor Box:** This box will be used for lost and found. It will be located near the First-Aid Lodge. A Scout is TRUSTWORTHY.

**Off limits:** Staff areas are off limits. DO NOT hike off the paths or roadways.

**Smoking areas:** Smoking is discouraged. Smoking is permitted in the designated smoking area behind the staff dining area near the barn only

**Campsites Safety:** Troop campsites may be inspected for health, safety and first aid readiness at any time by Camp Chief. References for these can be found in the Boy Scout Handbook and Field Guide.

**First Aid:** There should be a First Aid kit that is visible, accessible, marked and adequately stocked (as appropriate for size of the Troop). A posted list of the Troop’s qualified First Aid personnel is a good idea.

**Safety:** Fire fighting stations should be maintained by each Troop. The Fire Warden chart should be posted and fire fighting tools in plain sight and accessible. Tie-down lines for tents, rain flies and dining flies MUST be flagged.

**Rattlesnakes:** Rattlesnakes are present at Camp Pendleton and have been found at Rancho Las Flores in the past. Scoutmasters should brief all participants on immediate action for rattlesnake encounters. Stop. Look. Listen. If possible, back away slowly. Do not attempt to capture or detain a snake. If a rattlesnake is in an area which requires it to be removed, e.g. tent, patrol area, please contact the Camporee Staff who will contact the base game warden to remove the snake.

# Camporee Preparation Checklist

- \_\_\_ Encourage Scouts to participate in the Patrol Skill Events and Camp-wide Games.
- \_\_\_ Prepare for the skills events and check required equipment for the skills events
- \_\_\_ Secure all required equipment for the Troop and Patrols using the “Camporee Campsite Competition” form.
- \_\_\_ Bring a Unit Roster listing all adults and Scouts and their patrols in Camp
- \_\_\_ Make sure you have completed and turned-in your Tour Permit, and bring the approved Council office copy to the Camporee
- \_\_\_ Bring your copy of “The Guide to Safe Scouting”
- \_\_\_ Have available, permission slips and health history records for each Scout and adult
- \_\_\_ Have available Hold Harmless Agreement for all Participants (Scouts and Adults)
- \_\_\_ If applicable, bring balance of any Camporee fees
- \_\_\_ Ensure that all scouts have their 10 essentials and bring them to Camporee

# Camporee Awards

Participation Ribbon: A Unit participation ribbon will be presented to each troop

Over-all Troop Award: The top three (3) troops will receive special recognition ribbons. All troops will receive a troop prize. The top troops will be determined by the accumulated score from the:

a. Check-in process	50 Points
b. Morning Colors, (on-time with Patrol Flags)	25 Points
c. Uniform Inspection	100 Points
d. Campsite Inspection	100 Points
e. Patrol Activities	100 Points
f. Troop Activities	100 Points
e. SPL/SM Meeting	25 Points
<b>Total</b>	<b>500 Points</b>

The order in which troops will come up to choose their troop prizes will be determined by their over-all score.

Campsite Award. Campsite ribbons will be awarded to the top 3 Troops.

Gateway Award: Gateway ribbons will be awarded to the top 3 Troops.

Patrol Skill Events: The top 3 patrols will receive special recognition. The top patrols will be determined by adding up their scores for each activity.

Patrol Flag Awards: Ribbons will be awarded to the top 3 patrol flags.

Cooking Corral: Cook ribbons will be awarded to the top three cooking teams.

Troop Inspection Staff Award: The troop that presents the best overall impression during the uniform inspection will receive special recognition.

Patrol Spirit Ribbons: Staff will award those patrols who demonstrate exceptional scout spirit!

**Judges decisions are final and will not be disputed, discussed or argued. Remember scouting spirit, good sportsmanship and we are all out there to have fun.**

# Boy Scout Uniform Inspection

## The Boy Scouts of America's Official Policy

The Boy Scouts of America has always been a uniformed body. Its uniforms help to create a sense of belonging. They symbolize character development, citizenship training, and personal fitness. Wearing a uniform gives youth and adult members a sense of identification and commitment.

<b>10 Points</b>	<b>General Appearance.</b>
<b>20 Points</b>	<b>Shirt.</b> Official long- or short-sleeve tan shirt with red or green shoulder loops on epaulets.
<b>15 Points</b>	<b>Belt.</b> Official BSA belt (whether olive drab or black canvas or leather ) and BSA buckle.
<b>20 Points</b>	<b>Pants/Shorts.</b> Official, olive, pressed; no cuffs.
<b>15 Points</b>	<b>Socks.</b> Official olive-colored socks.
<b>5 Points</b>	<b>Shoes.</b> Leather or canvas, neat and clean. No open toe shoes.
<b>15 Points</b>	<b>Insignia.</b> Correct placement

# Camporee Patrol Flag Competition

## Competition Information

Every Patrol may enter the competition.

Patrol flag competition will be held during the noon hour on Saturday so as not to conflict with other events.

The judging area will be: Barn

Flags will be set-up by patrol in the designated area beginning at noon. Judging will begin at 12:15 PM.

Patrols need not remain in the judging area.

Flags may be picked up after 12:45 PM.

Flags should all be picked up by 1:00 PM.

## Standards for Developing a Patrol Flag:

1. The Patrol Flag must be hiking suitable, not larger than 24"x24."
2. Each flag must be clearly marked with the troop number.
3. Patrol flags must be hand made from leather, cloth, wood or other natural material. Paper or plastic flags will not qualify.
4. The patrol symbol or insignia must be included on the flag.
5. The flag must be attached to a wooden pole, stave or metal standard at least 4 feet tall, but no more than 7 feet tall.
6. Flags should display any patrol award or ribbon previously earned.

## Judging

Flags will be judged for:

Compliance to the Standards

Craftsmanship

Artistic design

Commercially produced flags will not be allowed to compete.

Patrol flags meeting the above standards will be judged on originality, use of color, Scout themes and reflection of the Patrol name. A Patrol Flag should reflect the high standards of Scouting.

Flags displaying poor taste will not be judged, and will not be allowed at the Camporee.

## **Patrol Skill Events**

There are 10 skill events. Patrols will receive award ribbons for top performance. The top 3 patrols will receive special recognition at the Campfire. The top patrols will be determined by the combined scores for each activity.

1. Every member of the patrol should know how to tie the knots and lashing required for rank advancement up to 1<sup>st</sup> Class.
2. Every member of the patrol should know map and compass skills required for rank advancement up to 1<sup>st</sup> Class.
3. The Patrol should know first aid skills required for rank advancement up to 1<sup>st</sup> Class.
4. The patrol should know how to build a fire.
5. All members of the patrol should know flag etiquette required for rank advancement up to 1<sup>st</sup> Class.
6. The patrol must be ready to work as a team.

## **Troop Events**

Troop events will be head-to-head events testing scouting skills and teamwork. Troops will compete per the published schedule in these events. Points towards the overall troop competition score will be awarded for each event completed.

This release of liability includes, but is not limited to claims based on negligence, both passive and active, of the government arising out of, or relating to any loss, damage (including loss of and damage to property), illness, death, or injury that may be sustained during my use of the Las Flores Adobe National Historic Landmark aboard Camp Pendleton. This release also applies to all dangers inherently involved in the activities in which I desire to participate. I understand that the risks involved in these activities include, but are not limited to, risks resulting from falling, colliding with obstacles, my personal physical condition, other participants, lack of hydration, interaction with animals both wild and domestic, injuries or death resulting from recreational activities, and a high volume of traffic by civilian and military vehicles.

I hereby authorize emergency medical treatment in the event of injury or illness. I also authorize trained health care providers, including, but not limited to physicians, nurses, nurse practitioners, emergency medical technicians and hospital corpsmen, to administer routine and/or emergency medicines and treatments, as needed.

This release shall remain in effect, indefinitely, from the date of signature until rescinded in a formal writing by the government.
