
A note from the District Chair continued







Homemade Ice Cream

What you'll need: 1 tablespoon sugar, 1/2 cup milk or half & half, 1/4 teaspoon vanilla, 6 tablespoons rock salt, 1 pint-size plastic food storage bag (e.g., Ziploc), 1 gallon-size plastic food storage bag, Ice cubes

How to make it:

Fill the large bag half full of ice, and add the rock salt. Seal the bag.

Put milk, vanilla, and sugar into the small bag, and seal it.

Place the small bag inside the large one, and seal it again carefully.

Shake until the mixture is ice cream, which takes about 5 minutes. Wipe off the top of the small bag, and then open it carefully. Enjoy!

Tips: A 1/2 cup milk will make about 1 scoop of ice cream, so double the recipe if you want more.

SPONGE RELAY RACE



You'll need 2 sponges, 2 buckets, 2 bowls and water. Have boys line up in two teams and the boys at the front of each row hold a bucket of water with the sponges in it and the boys at the end of each row hold a bowl. The first boy takes a wet sponge out of the bucket and hands it to the next boy and so on till it reaches the last boy in his row who squeezes the water out of the sponge and into bowl. He then races it back to the front, puts it back into the bucket and starts over again. Play continues until the water is gone or a certain time is up. The team, who has the most water in the bowl at the end, wins the game.

SHADOW TAG

A twist on the traditional game. To tag a person out you must step in their shadow. This can be tricky, depending on the time of day you play. Set a 2 minute limit for being "it" to keep variety up.




