THE LEGACY LATEST: RECENT UPDATES

For years, Scouting's mission to serve youth has been under attack by ongoing litigation from the ACLU to eliminate our use of Camp Balboa and our Youth Aquatic Center because we built those facilities on cityleased land. This would not only eliminate a permanent staff support center, but meeting and training facilities, campground, and Scout Shop as well. Although the Board of Directors expects a positive outcome in the next few years, the *Legacy of Values* campaign allows Scouting to "Be Prepared."

Last March, the Legacy of Values Campaign kicked-off with the recognition of our lead gift, \$2 million from Jack Filanc for the new Filanc Scout Resource Center. A year later, our campaign total has risen to \$4.3 million from community leaders and Scouting supporters from inside – and outside – our community.

These gifts have brought the campaign to the brink of action. With some additional support, we will soon be able to move ahead with plans to acquire the Filanc Scout Resource Center. 

Introduction to Outdoor Leader Skills-Webelos Leader Outdoor Training 20 & 21 May 2011, Vista Antique Gas & Steam Engine Museum 2040 North Santa Fe Ave. Vista CA 92084

The Santa Margarita District College of Outdoor Education will conduct its spring semester at the Vista Antique Gas & Steam Engine Museum on Friday, 20 May and Saturday, 21 May 2011. The college will host the following BSA training courses for registered adult leaders: <u>Introduction to Outdoor Leader Skills (IOLS) and Webelos Leader Outdoor Training (WLOT)</u>. These courses are specifically designed to prepare adult leaders to become Assistant Scoutmasters or Scoutmasters, and for Webelos leaders to qualify to lead their dens on overnight activities. The college will operate in conjunction with the 2011 Santa Margarita District Spring Camporee so that unit leaders who will be attending the camporee will have an opportunity to complete this training that weekend.

Cost for the course will be \$30.00 which will include all materials and meals. Early registration is recommended, but the college will accept same-day registrants. IOLS/WLOT participants need to arrive at the museum by 6:00 pm on Friday, 20 May. Both courses will be completed by 4:00 pm on the 21st of May. Scouters attending the college must do so in complete Scout uniform including neckerchief and slide, and need to bring a copy of their latest Youth Protection Training certificate for verification. All meals will be provided by the staff. In addition to personal items, please bring a tent, sleeping bag, pad or air mattress, folding chair, compass, pocket knife, Scout Handbook, and pen & notebook.






