The District Executive Minute -Jim Trageser

The recent increase in annual membership fees by the National office is throwing a monkey wrench into the budgets and annual plans of many Scout units across the country. The Boy Scouts of America is no more immune to the increasing cost of conducting business than any other outfit - even if our "business" is molding boys into the next generation of leaders for our nation. Health care and benefits for the staff at the National office are under the same pressures every other business faces.

Still, no matter how necessary, this price increase - from \$15 per year for each youth and adult member to \$24 - is leading to both units and Councils having to make some difficult decisions on funding priorities.

At the Council level, the pain is palpable: We've had to cut the after-school gang-prevention ScoutReach program at all but a couple of schools in the county - including all the campuses in North County. The five schools in the Oceanside Unified School District that had ScoutReach programs will not have them this year. Council underwrites the entire cost of Scouting for the ScoutReach program, and the \$9 per boy increase, amplified by some 2,500 boys council wide, was more than our budget could bear.

Here in Santa Margarita District, we already had plans in place to have every single public elementary school and nearly every private school recruited by a Pack and a Troop. I thank our units for stepping up and recruiting elementary campuses that have, in many cases, not been recruited for some years.

From what I'm hearing, this year's popcorn campaign is going gangbusters. I know quite a few of our units are already out of product and trying to get more. Council is aware of the shortages and working with Trail's End to get more in ASAP. Hopefully, the campaign continues strongly and helps our units balance their books and absorb the increase in fees.

I'm grateful to all of you for your hard work and good cheer on behalf of our boys.

Eagle Project

Local Boy Scout completes Eagle Service Project at Carlsbad High School

Local Scout Chase Heck, from Boy Scouts of America Troop 750 in Carlsbad, recently completed his Eagle Scout Service Project at Carlsbad High School. His project involved building and installing high visibility, permanent trash receptacles to reduce litter and improve the appearance of the new parking lot completed last year. This parking lot is used daily by Carlsbad High School students and is also used for many public events held at the Carlsbad Cultural Arts Center.



Chase is a 2013 graduate of Carlsbad High School (CHS). While a student at CHS, he saw that the school renovations greatly improved its appearance and enhanced the neighborhood. However trash was discarded in the parking lot every day, making it less appealing and reflecting poorly on the student body. He observed that trash receptacles were not available in the parking lot itself, only inside the school gates, which might give the impression there was no place to discard trash. His solution was to place the receptacles directly in the parking lot and paint them in the CHS school colors, purple and white. They bear a personal message encouraging people to follow the scouting ideal of "Leave No Trace". This will be coordinated with a publicity campaign through the school newspaper.

An Eagle Scout Service Project is a major step in the completion of the Eagle rank, Scouting's highest award. The project is an opportunity for the scout to demonstrate his leadership skills while performing a service that will have lasting benefit to his community. The scout must make a proposal, create a plan, obtain permissions, raise money, organize and lead others in doing the actual project work. The National Eagle Scout Association estimates that Eagle service projects bring more than three million hours of volunteer work to US communities. Only about 4% of all boys who join the Boy Scouts of America complete all the requirements for the rank of Eagle Scout.
