
Jason Hansen Named a "40 Under 40" Recipient!



Eagle Scout Connor Stotts -Hero!

On July 31, 2011 Eagle Scout Connor Stotts of Oceanside and five of his friends were swimming in the ocean near the Oceanside Pier. Moving further from the shore, the six friends were unaware that they were being methodically pulled out to sea by the rip-tide current until the water was suddenly over their heads.

Realizing that they could no longer touch the bottom, the six friends began to try desperately to swim back to the shore. With the group making no headway, Connor Stotts realized that they were caught in a rip tide current. Having attended the Oceanside City Junior Lifeguard Program two years in a row, and having completed the Boy Scouts of America Lifeguard certification, Connor understood the implications of what was happening to the group. He quickly instructed his fellow swimmers in the dynamics of the current they were caught in, and explained the best way for them to ride it out in order to return to shore safely. Unfortunately, fatigue was setting in on his fellow swimmers, and when one of the girls began to go under from exhaustion, Connor began the first of three rescues.

After getting the first two victims close enough to shore to touch bottom, Connor returned to find the rest of the group had drifted even further out, with one so exhausted that she was only semi-conscious by the time he made it to shore. As he carried her onto the beach, adults realizing that there was an emergency notified Emergency Services. The victims were treated for shock and eventually released to their parents' care.

The three swimmers credit Connor's courageous actions with saving their lives. Congratulations Connor- We're proud of you!


