#### The District Executive Minute -Jim Trageser

Nowhere in any of the holy books of any of the world's major religions is easy passage through life promised us. Instead, what we are taught is that we will be buffeted by forces beyond our influence, often able to control not what happens to us but only how we choose to respond to these often strenuous challenges.

As the Boy Scouts of America grapples with its place in a changing social and cultural landscape, those of us charged with delivering the Scouting program to the youth in our community best serve those boys (and girls, through Venturing and Sea Scouts) by hewing to Scouting's values.

For the vast majority of us who do not have a vote at the National Council, no direct say in what the policies of the Boy Scouts of America will – or should – be, all we can control during the often tumultuous debate regarding our policies is how we will conduct ourselves. In our interactions with those who may hold vastly different views from our own on what is best for the Scouting movement, if we all look to the Scout Law and Scout Oath to guide our actions, we cannot go wrong.

Among other virtues, a Scout is courteous, kind, cheerful, loyal and reverent. We are also called on to help other people at all times. None of those characteristics indicate that we will all agree on even major issues. Rather, they were wisely crafted to allow people of widely divergent views to get along with one another in a spirit of camaraderie and good will.

If we allow these values to guide our actions in even the most trying of times, then our challenges will also become opportunities to lead by example.

Because sadly we live in times in which political differences are emphasized, when other people's very value is based on their beliefs. We live in an era when it is expected that we will castigate, condemn and cut ties with those who think, believe and feel differently than we do.

It has not always been such in our nation. This cultural coarseness is not indicative of what is best in America.

Let us as Scouts remind the nation we humbly serve that it is not only possible to get along with folks with whom we disagree, but that we are called on to do so – and to do so not out of a grudging sense of obligation, but rather from a cheerful realization that we are none of us perfect and that we all want to be granted the assumption of our good hearts.






